Dare: We know that olive oil comes from olives. Tell us how we get baby oil from babies.

Dare: Hold this package of cheese - and then sell us on why we should eat cheese every day.

Dare: Answer this: How much deeper would oceans be if sponges didn't live there?

Dare: Answer this: What hair colour do they put on the driver's licenses of bald men?

Dare: Answer this: Why are a wise man and a wise guy opposites?

Dare: Tell us a story with as many different voices and accents as possible. (Eg. English woman, German male)

Dave: Answer this: When someone asks you, "A penny for your thoughts," and you put your two cents in, what happens to the other penny?

Dare: Why does no one ever say, "It's only a game," when their team is winning?

Dare: Put the hat the Table Topics Master gives you on your head - and then tell us why women should start wearing hats again.

Dare: Run outside. Count to 30. Then come inside again and tell us what you saw.

With the Table Topic above, get one person to start sneezing when you cross your arms, and another person to drop a book or heavy object when you scratch your face. Toastmasters teaches us how to handle situations that make speaking sometimes difficult. (You could also send someone out of the room to ring a bell or start singing.)

Dare: Run outside. Count to 30. Then come inside again and tell us what you heard.

With the Table Topic above, have one half of the room smile and nod their heads while the person speaks. The other half of the room is to frown, sit back in their chairs and look bored or disapproving. Explain what they are supposed to do while the person is outside.

Dare: Tell us a joke.

Dare: When Gerber started selling baby food in Africa, they used the same packaging as in the US, with the beautiful baby on the label. Later they learned that in Africa, companies routinely put pictures on the label of what's inside, since most people can't read English. Tell us why they should keep the packaging.
